Board Minutes 11 September 2006

Meeting was called to order at 6:30PM. A quorum was present with Fred-W2EMS, Darlene-N2XQG, Dennis-WA2JWO, Peter-W2BEW, Mark-KA2FBZ, Al-KA1IEG, Ed-KC2MIN and guest Jim-K2LM in attendance.

A moment of silence was observed for all those who were lost in the terrible events of five years ago today; attendance was then taken, and minutes MSC for the last (August) meeting.

The President's Report:

- Soliciting new meeting program topics from members. Any ideas?? Need volunteer(s) for program coordinator. Any members wish to volunteer??
- Constitution & Bylaws review: modest changes to be submitted to membership for vote at October meeting. Among proposed changes:
 - RACES will be known informally as "Saratoga County Amateur Radio Association." Legal name will remain Saratoga County RACES Assn., Inc.
 - Section on quorum (10% of membership) required for voting is removed. (Number of members constantly changes and we often do not have 10% at general meetings). Voting can still be done in person, by written proxy or by absentee ballot.
- Radio Room: Mark and Fred to re-schedule Phase I - inventory and test. Room needs to be usable by October 1 Simulated Emergency Test.
- Sunday night nets: If you don't hear a Net Control, feel free to jump in and take over. The experience is very valuable in time of real emergency.

- In the process of securing Wilton EMS door cards w/ photos for new directors.
- Repeater PL tone change: Jim, K2LM, suggested moving .00 PL tone off 100Hz, because of interference from New Hampshire machine using same tone. He will survey region and recommend an unused tone for future move. Members will be given ample notice.

Vice-President's Report:

- 2006 Hamfest recap:
 - 472 paid admissions; slightly more than last year (468) but slightly less than recent years
 - Total revenue (\$3466.05) less expenses (\$1709.72) = \$ 1716.03 NET, compared to \$1295 last year.
 - Nine candidates took exams; 8 passed; 2 are Extras. Congratulations and thanks to VE's.
 - Next year's event will be Sept 8th OR 15th; Darlene to negotiate.

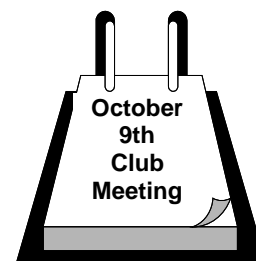
Treasurer's Report:

Radio Officer Dave — N2FEP

Summer has come to a close and the hamfest is history for the 21st time.

October brings cooler temps and the S.E.T. short for Simulated Emergency Test. This year we will run ours on October 1st as previously announced. Please make an attempt to participate. We will be activating our E.O.C. (Emergency Operations Center) at Wilton EMS. There will be a net called up. Listen to the repeaters on that date. There will be information on the weekly Sunday evening net.

I am looking for ideas for drills for the up coming months. They do not have to be elaborate. We can do simple things even contests from the club station is good training. Lets become proactive and ready just in case. This is our club and our hobby, lets get some enjoyment out of it.

I am pleased to announce that the new antenna was installed on 147.360 on Sunday September 10th the day after the hamfest. Many thanks to Rusty KE2PW for climbing and installing the antenna and removing the old one that had died. He was in the air on the tower for 3 hrs. It is tough work at 140ft in the air. I also want to thank the ground crew KC2MSB Terri my XYL, N2WDY Bob , N2QFT Joanna and her OM Dick who without them 36 would be off the air. They provide the property for the tower and the building, the electricity to run the whole thing.

147.360 is the Saratoga County ARES repeater and without the assistance of the club and its members 36 would go silent forever in our area. It now has the coverage it once enjoyed when I first purchased it from KC2IV Bob Phillips in 1995. We have had many trials with it such as 1996 the commercial tower failed and smashed all the antennas and hardline, replace that with a temp antenna and a temp shack at a temp location for 6 months. Then we put it on the air limited from my location but that was not a good coverage area for it. Then with lots of donations of tower (140ft of Rhon 45) and installation of it by N2LUD, KA2QYE and others , donations of new 110 watt repeater deck , a flatbed to move the 10 ton building of steel. The list goes on.

Echolink is running on 36 same as on 00; all controls are the same. Soon a new controller will be installed and

echolink will be at the repeater site.

Internet connection for 36 will be via WiFi from N2QFTs home which I will place a router there for her use and the repeater. It also sports a weather radio direct connect to NWS for emergency weather announcements. That only provides coverage for Saratoga, Montgomery, and Fulton counties and that is so we know when bad weather from the West is on the way. That service is provided via a CAT interface and a vhf receiver directly connected to the repeater.

36 provides many services to the ham community. Take a listen and try it out and let me know how it sounds to you.

Weekly Radio Net

Please join us on the air each Sunday evening at 8PM for our weekly net. With this frequently held event we hope to be able to provide timely information to area amateurs as well as provide a forum for selling/ swapping gear and discussing topics in a formally directed net environment.

The 147.00 and 147.24 repeaters are linked by the 448.225 machine during this net, so feel free to check in on any of the repeaters.

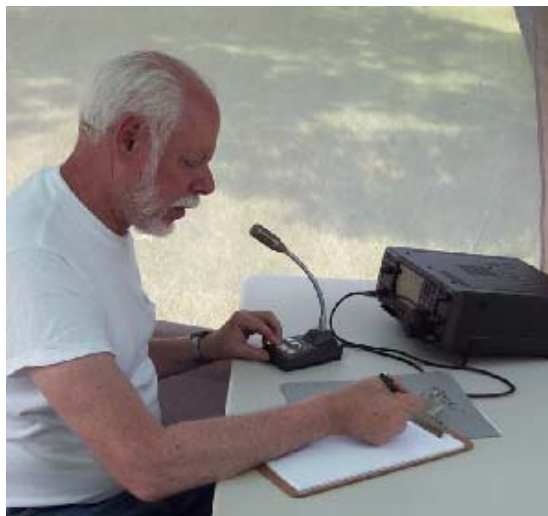

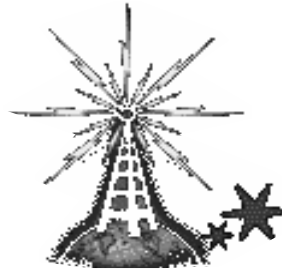
