### Saratoga County RACES / ARES SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST (S.E.T.) OCTOBER 14, 2007

**13:00 HRS** - NET BEGINS ON ALL REPEATERS  
AFTER LINKING SYSTEM

- LISTEN FOR **NET PREAMBLE**: "THIS IS callsign, NET CONTROL FOR SARATOGA COUNTY ARES / RACES FOR THE SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST."
- THIS IS A DRILL. ALL STATIONS NOT DIRECTLY CONNECTED TO THIS DRILL ARE ASKED TO FIND ANOTHER REPEATER DURING THIS TEST EXERCISE. THIS IS callsign; ALL STATIONS PLEASE STANDBY.
- THIS IS callsign NET CONTROL. TODAY'S DRILL HAS CHANGED, AS THE WILTON EMERGENCY CORPS BUILDING IS NOT AVAILABLE. TODAY'S DRILL WILL CONSIST OF INFORMATION ABOUT TODAY'S WEATHER.
- STATIONS TO JOIN THE NET, PLEASE GIVE YOUR CALLSIGN PHONETICALLY, YOUR NAME, AND YOUR LOCATION (EXAMPLE, BARKERSVILLE RD. TOWN OF PROVIDENCE). GO SLOWLY, ONE AT A TIME.
- (ACKNOWLEDGE CHECKINS BY CALL AND LOCATION.)
- THIS IS callsign, NET CONTROL. TODAY WE ARE PROVIDING WEATHER INFORMATION FOR THE SET. I WILL ASK EACH STATION FOR THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION — EIGHT ITEMS IN TOTAL:

- TEMPERATURE IN DEGREES FAHRENHEIT
- RAINFALL AT THE CURRENT TIME.
- TOTAL RAIN FOR THIS EVENT
- WIND CONDITIONS AT YOUR LOCATION AT THIS TIME.
- DO YOU HAVE **EMERGENCY POWER** AVAILABLE TO YOU
- DO YOU HAVE A **WEATHER STATION** SUCH AS RAIN GAUGE, WIND INDICATOR, BAROMETER, ETC.
- ARE YOU REGISTERED AS A **SKYWARN SPOTTER**.
- ARE YOU A MEMBER OF THE **ARES YAHOO GROUP**.



● I WILL NOW CALL EACH STATION FOR THE INFORMATION. THIS IS callsign, NET CONTROL.

● (CALL EACH STATION AND ASK THE ABOVE AND LOG INFORMATION.)

● THIS COMPLETES TODAY'S SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST. I WANT TO THANK EVERYONE FOR YOUR PARTICIPATION IN THIS DRILL. THANKS TO SARATOGA COUNTY RACES ASSOCIATION FOR THE USE OF THE REPEATERS. THE LINK WILL BE TERMINATED AND THE REPEATERS WILL BE OPEN FOR REGULAR USE.

## Board of Directors Meeting September 10, 2007

Meeting was called to order at 6:33 pm. Board members present: Fred – W2EMS; Darlene – N2XQG; Al – KA1IEG; Peter – W2BEW; Dennis – WA2JWO; Byron – K2BD; Ed – AB2XA; Dave – NR2J; Dave – N2FEP. Minutes of previous meeting were approved.

### Discussion/Action Items:

- Fred reported that the club is now listed on the ARRL website as an affiliated club
- Fred reported that the club is negotiating with Wilton EMS to reserve our meeting room through next year, so we will not be relegated to the garage again.
- There was a discussion of the Hamfest, which was very successful (see Darlene's complete Wrap-Up Report in this issue). Some suggestions for next time:
  - Gate keepers should give quick instructions to attendees on where to park and where to drop door prize tickets
  - Members should be encouraged to stick around after the event to help clean up and restore the area. Volunteers should keep this last step in mind.
  - Next year's date cannot be confirmed for a few more weeks; either 9/7 or 9/14/08.
- Al., KA1IEG, gave the treasurer's report (including expenses and receipts from Hamfest):
  - Beginning bal. - \$ 7823.67
  - Closing bal. - \$10,312.20 (plus \$10 in quarters)
- Dave, N2FEP, gave the Radio officer's report:
  - Jim, K2LM, is working with the county Emergency Services Coordinator to arrange to move the 146.00 repeater to the National Grid site on Spruce Mountain in Corinth. The new antenna will not be on a tower – it will be on the building. Consequently, coverage of the .00 repeater may suffer somewhat.
  - All current towers and buildings on Spruce Mtn will be removed, as equipment is moved to the new site.
  - The 147.24 repeater may also move to a new site in Providence next year
  - A Simulated Emergency test (SET) will be held in October (see announcement)
- Byron, K2BD, gave a Field Day wrap-up report, including:
  - It was a great learning experience, but we learned that the club is not fully prepared for emergency communications. We need to supplement our equipment and misc. items.
  - We need overnight commitments from operators
  - We need to locate manuals for equipment and review them before the need arises
- The Board voted to reimburse Byron for minor over-budget expenses, and to provide \$50 for wear and tear on his personal generator, which was needed.
- Dave, NR2J, asked for members to submit their ideas for meeting programs to him asap.
- Peter reported that the club picked up a number of new members and renewals at the Hamfest.

Meeting adjourned at 7:33 PM.

### Discussion/Action Items:

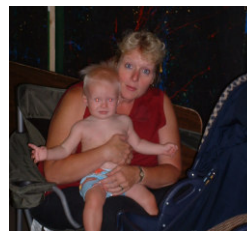

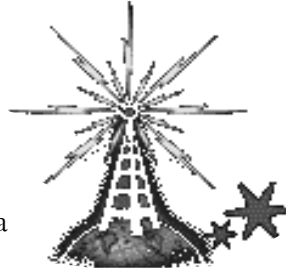




## WA2UMX ON THE INTERNET

The club operates two 2-meter repeaters. The 147.24 repeater is located 15 miles west of Saratoga Springs at Lake Nancy. This repeater has a members-only phone patch. The 147.00 repeater is located 10 miles north of Saratoga Springs on Spruce Mountain, near Corinth, NY. This repeater offers an "emergency" phone patch. These two machines, in combination, offer excellent North to South and East to West communications far beyond Saratoga County. These repeaters are linked together at various times by the club's third repeater on 448.225 MHz.  
**PL Tone for all club repeaters is now 91.5 Hz.**
